Jim Manera at 89 years young mows the big Ross domain sport ground on a weekly basis, which takes him 4-5 hours on his ride-on mower. He collects around 7 trailer loads of grass clippings... what a worker and such a modest man.

In Kumara there is Fiona Pollard who is the chairperson of the Kumara Residents Trust who, like Biddy in Ross, is so passionate on making Kumara a leader for other small towns on the West Coast to follow, with the information panels on the town's history and its people. With the planned Kumara Chinese Miners Memorial reserve which will be a great welcome to visitors and tourists hitting the gateway to the West Coast.

Phyllis Stuart, in her late eighties, is a grand lady always in involved with things in Kumara. There is a moral to these elder people being so active in their communities, they certainly will not rust out.






